The Rescue Mission sees hunger and homelessness in its entirety. For the Mission, taking care of homeless men, women, and children isn't simply about meeting physical needs — food, shelter, clothing — it's just as important to address mental, emotional, and spiritual needs. Each year, the Mission serves 225,000 meals and provides 120,000 safe nights of shelter, along with Transitional Housing, Children and Teen programs, Veterans Ministry, Addiction Recovery, and other programs to help individuals successfully get back on their feet.

Mission: Boise Rescue Mission Ministries is restoring faith, hope, and family by reaching out to the community, teaching the Word of God, and providing food, shelter, clothing, and opportunities to recover from homelessness.



About: Since 1988, Ronald McDonald House Charities of Idaho (RMHC of Idaho) has been keeping families of sick children together – giving them a place to rest and refresh. RMHC of Idaho supports families of ill or injured children through our Idaho Ronald McDonald House® in Boise, Ronald McDonald Family Room® in Idaho Falls, and Happy Wheels Hospitality Carts in Boise and Twin Falls. Research shows that RMHC programs have a direct impact by enabling family-centered care and providing the emotional and physical comfort families need.

The Idaho Foodbank

About: The Idaho Foodbank is an independent, donor-supported, nonprofit organization founded in 1984, and is the largest distributor of free food assistance in Idaho. From warehouses in Boise, Lewiston and Pocatello, the Foodbank has distributed more than 135 million pounds of food to Idaho families through a network of more than 230 community-based partners. These include rescue missions, church pantries, emergency shelters and community kitchens. The Foodbank also operates direct-service programs that promote healthy families and communities through good nutrition.

Mission: To help feed, educate and advocate for Idaho's hungry through collaborative partnerships to develop efficient solutions that strengthen individuals, families and communities. women, and children in need.



About: The Meridian Food Bank has been serving neighbors in need for more than a decade. They began operating in 1999 as the Valley Shepherd Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Center. Initially, the center was a place for homeless and low-income people in Meridian to receive food and clothing. In 2004, they began operating as a nonprofit food pantry doing business as the Meridian Food Bank. The Meridian Foodbank was started by volunteers and remains an all-volunteer organization. No salaries have ever been paid. Typically over 200 volunteers support and operate the Foodbank.

Mission: To provide nutritional services that meet the food insecurity needs of individuals and families throughout the Treasure Valley.



About: St. Vincent de Paul Southwest Idaho is focused on helping neighbors in need with housing expenses, food, clothing, furniture, and other basic human needs. Last year, SVDP served 24,182 people in person to person visits, and distributed \$519,320 in direct financial aid. Furthermore, they provided millions more in groceries, clothes, bicycles, and other key necessities. This work has been made possible since the 1940s through the generous support of our community.
